We are excited to announce the latest edition of the [International Journal of Biomedical Laboratory Science \(IJBLs\)](#) has been published!

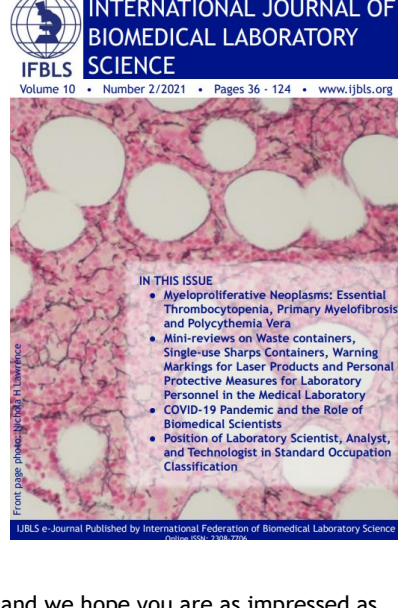
The IJBLs is an online peer-reviewed journal published bi-annually by the International Federation of Biomedical Laboratory Sciences (IFBLS).

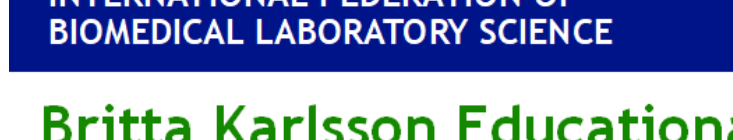
